Project Reports 2009 Humanitarian Crisis & IDP Relief

From January through May 2009, the North and East of Sri Lanka experienced an intense spike in violence, as the country's long-standing civil conflict continued to play out. The war was officially declared over in May 2009 when the government regained control

over all territory. As a result of the conflict, hundreds of thousands of persons were displaced, and daily life was severely disrupted throughout the affected regions. Since February 2009, IMHO responded to the needs as they arose. With many thousands still remaining in Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camps across northern Sri Lanka, IMHO remains committed to serving the humanitarian needs of these persons and others on the outside who have been affected by this conflict. IMHO's efforts in response to this ongoing humanitarian situation up until November 2009 have so far included:





What a difference this all has made in helping those at the ground to save lives and to improve the conditions and quality of life for those who survived this terrible tragedy. By responding to the needs of local partner organizations and taking a diverse approach, IMHO has been able to help fill in the gaps and draw attention to those most in need.





Primary Care

At its core, IMHO's main commitment is to primary care and public health in disadvantaged and under-served areas. In 2009, IMHO continued its commitment by supporting local hospitals and clinics in providing basic, essential medicines to poor patients who lack the financial means of paying for such medicines.

Another ongoing pledge is to operating mobile medical clinics in rural and underserved areas all over Sri Lanka through primary care centers, offices of various hospitals, and local partner organizations. The mobile clinics provide general medical consultation along with free medications such as antibiotics, vitamins, painkillers, and more.



Amongst other efforts, support for local doctors, nurses, and health workers was also continued this year, by providing incentive allowances and other general support for these persons to work in very remote and disadvantaged communities.

Mental Health


One of IMHO's primary areas of focus is that of mental health. The overarching goal with every mental health effort is to help those struggling with mental illness or disability to learn to live independently. Getting patients access to the latest medications with the least amount of side effects is also crucial.

IMHO supported a psychiatric unit in Vavuniya, which was opened in 2009



and has played a critical role in responding to the needs of the IDPs who arrived in large numbers in the nearby IDP camps. IMHO also committed financial support to local partners in Sri Lanka for various other mental health projects, including the development of an acute in-patient psychiatric unit in Negombo, establishment of a microcredit welfare fund for patients in Kalmunai, support for a Mental Health Day celebration in Kalmunai, and support for an existing multi-disciplinary counseling team & an existing mobile community mental health team in Jaffna.

Emergency Relief



Specialty Care

Many of IMHO's efforts in hospital and clinic development have been in various fields of specialty, with the overarching goal of improving and developing the health care infrastructure in under-served regions. Throughout 2009 IMHO engaged in various capacity building efforts to help train and support



doctors and health workers. IMHO gave donations of medical equipment to hospitals and brought attention to the issue of a much needed cardiology unit in Jaffna. General support and assistance were given to cancer patients. Additionally, IMHO helped to establish an Intensive Care Unit, Diabetic Center, Telemedicine Unit, and Post Anesthetic Care Unit at the Jaffna Teaching Hospital.
