Saturday morning featured a similar information session aimed however, at the various Tamil community organizations that included village, school and other similar associations within the GTA. This session was extremely well attended and a number of the participants requested further meetings with IMHO Canada in order to explore how the needs of the people they represent in Sri Lanka could be best met using IMHO's ability to deliver projects on the ground in Sri Lanka

The convention's gala event took place Saturday evening and featured a delicious traditional Sri Lankan style sit-down dinner to a sold-out hall that was preceded by a few presentations and the much anticipated speech from Chief Guest, Sir Dr. Arulkumaran, which most certainly lived up to expectations. Sir Dr. Arulkumaran, a distinguished gynecologist from the UK, was recently knighted for his contributions to medicine. He very graciously agreed to be the Chief Guest for the night's events, and his presence and keynote address both humbled and inspired the audience, especially the younger members. The presentations from the visiting physicians from the North and the East of Sri Lanka generated considerable discussion and food for thought among the attendees, which IMHO Canada hopes will translate into support both monetarily and otherwise for its future projects.

In summary, the convention was a great success and the large number of attendees at the various sessions, as well as the sold-out gala dinner, meant that the primary objective of raising awareness of not only IMHO Canada but of the continuing pressing needs in Sri Lanka was met. IMHO Canada now intends to build on this awareness and momentum by establishing links with the various groups within the community in the GTA as well as in the UK and USA towards moving its mandate forward and providing much needed health care and social services in Sri Lanka.

## Update on Efforts in Sri Lanka & Ethiopia

IMHO is pleased to announce its support for the following development and assistance projects in Sri Lanka and Ethiopia over the past few months:

**1.** \$2,400 for ongoing maintenance expenses and programs at the Jaffna Diabetic Center in Jaffna, Sri Lanka.




- **2.** \$10,000 towards the establishment of a Model Regional Center for Deaf Education, Empowerment, and Information Delivery in Bahir Dar, Northwest Ethiopia. This project is set to commence this September with the hiring of 2 full-time highly trained teachers of the deaf to benefit both students and other local teachers, and the provision of educational supplies and equipment for 21 regional schools with special classrooms for deaf students. IMHO matched a \$5,000 contribution from a generous donor for this project.
- **3.** \$20,000 to the local Rotary Club to buy Operating Room equipment for the Tellipalai Base Hospital in Northern Sri Lanka.
- **4.** \$8,100 to the Tellipalai Mental Health Society for the establishment of an out-patient transportation facility and to purchase 10 bicycles for patients residing at the "Kudil" rehabilitation center for patients with severe mental illness.
- **5.** \$7,050 to the Jaffna Hospital Development Association to support mental health care workers who work as part of the regional multi-disciplinary mental health team serving the Northern Province.

- 6. \$5,000 to Sivan Arul Illam for the construction of tube wells and toilets to improve sanitation facilities and promote proper hygiene in Mannar, Sri Lanka.
- 7. \$250 to Survivors Associated to buy 3 wheelchairs for paraplegic patients needed mobility assistance in Kilinochchi.
- 8. \$5,000 to Vallapalai Kannaky Amman Kovil Trust to support livelihoods development projects for the benefit of families in Mullaithivu, specifically for the purchasing of livestock such as goats and cows.
