

According to the World Bank, poverty and inequality between economic classes have been rising in Sri Lanka since 2019 due to the unstable economic situation, uncertain politics and the COVID pandemic. Even though the Sri Lankan economy shows signs of stabilizing, poverty rates continued to rise for the fourth year in a row, with an estimated 25.9% of Sri Lankans living below the poverty line in 2023. At IMHO, we fund projects all over the island, but have taken special care to focus on the most underserved and overlooked areas. We strive to invest in projects that are sustainable and will result in long lasting change by empowering the beneficiaries to improve their own circumstances.

Eyesight is a basic sense that is critical to daily functioning. In Sri Lanka and many other developing nations, people suffer vision loss due to conditions that are easily preventable or treatable. For example, cataracts are a common condition associated with age and sun exposure that can have a significant effect on vision. These are easily treated with a simple day surgery procedure.

750 people improved their vision with injections supported by \$19,518.48. Between Dec 2022 and March 2024, \$100,000 was spent for about 5,100 cataract surgeries, equipment and medications for eye conditions. These projects were done in partnership with Alaka Foundation, Malaysia.









HEALTH SURGICAL SERVICES



TRANSPLANT - On January 18, 2023, the first kidney transplant from a living donor was done at the Jaffna Teaching hospital. This was made possible through the enthusiastic efforts of the Surgical, Anesthesia, Nephrology and the Renal care team at Jaffna Teaching Hospital.

Dr. Sathiyamoorthy, Director JTH, played a key role in dealing with legalities and ensuring that all the required resources were available. This would not have been possible without the support of our donors who helped develop the operating room and High Dependency Unit.

Dr. Thavam Thambipillai, President of International College of Surgeons (USA), Professor of Surgery at Stanford School of Medicine and an IMHO board member, helped supervise the procedure. The surgery was a great success and the patient is doing extremely well.



Kidney transplants are the most successful of the organ transplant surgeries and a transplanted kidney can last for up to 20 years! This has a huge positive impact on patient quality of life and lifespan.

LAPAROSCOPY – Laparoscopy is surgery that is

done through small holes using a camera and special equipment to reach into the abdomen. This technique is associated with significantly less pain and a much faster recovery time than traditional open surgery. While this is often the standard of care in Western countries, a lack of equipment has prevented this technique from becoming widespread in Sri Lanka. Rajaratnam/Synamon Foundation funded a laparoscopic video tower and laparoscopic equipment to Jaffna Teaching Hospital. This was implemented by IMHO for a total cost of \$133,200.

HEALTH HIGH DEPENDENCY UNIT

Mark & Donna Penny, Team Solihull (UK) helped open the Pediatric High Dependency Unit (HDU) in memory of Mark's beloved sister Ms. Sonya Lynch, a Pediatric nurse practitioner from Cork, Ireland. Two HDU were funded – one at Kalmunai Base Hospital and one at the Batticaloa Teaching Hospital.

The hospital benefited from a brand-new HDU featuring:

- Air-conditioning and fans
- Bedside oxygen flow
- New windows and furniture
- A resuscitation area

This ward was renovated and upgraded in loving memory of

Sonya Lynch

a paediatric nurse from Cork, Ireland. It was funded by her family and friends, IMHO USA, Assist RR UK, and the community of Solihull School.

HEALTH HOSPITAL SUPPORT



Jaffna Teaching Hospital

A much needed Day Care Center for cancer patients was opened in October 2023. This program allows patients to receive surgical and medical care on an outpatient basis so that they can return to the comfort of their homes in the evenings. Staff salary to be reimbursed by IMHO.



Batticaloa Teaching Hospital

We supported a Learning Room in the Pediatric Unit so that hospitalized children could continue their studies and not fall behind their peers.





Upcountry Dickoya Hospital

We provided two new toilets to improve sanitation facilities within the hospital. We upgraded waste management by renovating the roof and the incinerator room. The water supply for the hospital was improved and a road and ramp were constructed for the eye unit to enhance accessibility for patients.

STAFF SALARY


Human resources and the ability to offer regular pay remains a roadblock to health services in Sri Lanka. We support staff salaries in several crucial areas to help retain skilled personnel.

Jaffna Teaching Hospital - Diabetic center, Cardiothoracic unit, Cancer day care services **Tellipalai Hospital** - Mental health services Mathavam Center for neurodevelopmental disorders Valaichchenai Base Hospital - Gender based violence unit Uyirilai Center for people with spinal cord injuries **Batticaloa Teaching Hospital** - Cardiology Kalmunai Base Hospital - Diabetic center



Mental health is an often overlooked area of general health that can immensely impact all aspects of well-being. IMHO helped facilitate the construction of the NP Maadam Extended Stay Residential Facility for those with severely disabling mental illness who are unable to take care of themselves or who have been abandoned by their families. This facility can currently house 12 clients at a time

This was made possible by the generous donation of a \$110,000 by a single family in loving memory of their relative. The project was facilitated by IMHO USA and constructed by IMHO Lanka. It will be handed over to TMHS.



"Kudil" is an intermediate residential care facility for mental health rehabilitation designed to help the clients regain their potential in basic self-care, vocational training and activities that help them learn to live a more independent life.

Total cost = \$450,000

"With the motto, "Gateway to Life", Kudil has helped over 400 individuals and families in the past decade. Unlike psychiatric institutions, this facility treats persons with mental health conditions as equals, while also facilitating an environment where they can regain or enhance their capabilities."

In some areas of the Northern Province, there is only one medical doctor for every 5,000 people. This makes it extremely difficult for the public to access healthcare services and people are dying from very preventable problems. For those living in remote areas, lack of access to transportation severely limits access to care. We support a variety of mobile health and outreach services to help fill this gap.

Health Awareness & Promotion - IMHO funded community health workers for health awareness programs. Community health workers in the Kilinochchi area were trained to identify cases that need medical attention, assist in education and basic primary care to complement the work of the doctors and alleviate some of their workload. This promotes preventative health care practices and allows the doctors to focus on more complex clinical work.

HEALTH JAFFNA JAIPUR CENTRE

The Jaffna Jaipur Center for Disability Rehabilitation is the only centre providing prosthetic and orthopaedic services in Jaffna. The centre also provides mobility devices, physiotherapy services, micro credit loans and student educational grants to the differently abled. Its mission is to empower those with physical disabilities by giving them the tools necessary to live a full and productive life. Last year IMHO gave \$9000 to Jaipur for artificial limbs and prosthesis to benefit about 572 people.

MASKELIYA SCHOOL DENTAL PROJECT

Under the leadership of the Regional Dental Surgeon, Dr. Rantheni, 300 students received free dental care and benefited from an oral health awareness program for parents and teachers. The program was supported by IMHO and will be expanded to the rest of Hatton and Nuwara Eliya Zones.

We believe that one of the most worthwhile investments is early childhood education. Giving children the opportunity to learn and grow in a safe and healthy environment propels the upward mobility of them, their families and society as a whole. In the last 5 years, we have supported over 1000 students to complete their preschool education and continue their primary education in government schools



EDUCATION SMART BOARDS

Since 2022, 150 smart boards have been donated to schools in the Northern, Eastern, Northwestern and Central provinces in partnership with the Ratnam Foundation. NWP Tamil medium schools have very limited educational resources. The Smart Board Project was carried out by IMHO USA and Ratnam Foundation with the support of Zonal Education Departments to compensate for the loss of human resources by providing a teaching system through digital smart boards to schools with more than 75 students. The program was also launched at Manalkunru and Senarath Muslim MV in Puttalam, Karukupanai Tamil Junior School and Udappu Kuselam TV in Chilaw. Supported and funded by IMHO and Ratnam Foundation.


EDUCATION HIGHER EDUCATION



EDUCATION RENOVATIONS

Sri Korakkar TMV School has 303 students between Grade 1 – 13. The lack of a perimeter wall compromised safety during evening classes due to the proximity of substance abusers in the area and animals feeding on crops planted by the students. We recently built a wall to help secure the school perimeter leading to a safer and more secure learning environment. **Total cost \$6,500.**





EP Uthayapuram TMV School, Kallaru, Batticaloa serves 300 impoverished students from Grade 1-11. The school needed urgent repair of a badly leaking roof. They only had one toilet without a door for girls and none at all for the boys. There was no fencing around the perimeter leaving the students vulnerable to the substance users outside. IMHO renovated the building, repaired the toilets, built a boundary wall and provided a clean water supply as well as a new computer room. **Total cost \$42,000**

We have funded several projects in remote areas to empower people through vocational training. By teaching a way to independently earn an income, we hope these programs will catalyze economic growth and prosperity within the community.

COMMUNITY MOTHERS CLUB

Mothers clubs are self-help groups formed by women in various villages. They are mainly involved with income generation and other women's empowerment activities. Most of these women support their families single-handedly. Many of the community health workers are also members of the local mother's clubs, which are becoming stronger and more successful with each year. These groups give these women economic empowerment and a sense of support, community and camaraderie.

COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT

FISHING BOATS - Fishing is a traditional way of life for many Sri Lankan families, providing income and food for the family and the village. IMHO has been providing livelihood support for fisherman families by providing boats for the fisherman to allow them to independently earn their own living. The total IMHO donation for the Batticaloa project was \$32,000. The fishing boat project in Karainagar had 34 beneficiaries, some of whom were women. **Total cost \$13,333**, half from the grant and half from IMHO.







CARING HANDS – The Caring Hands project in Upcountry Sri Lanka provides dry food, home garden facilities and motivational training to almost 300 beneficiaries in Kotagala and Maskeliya. Support provided includes home and school visits and monthly guardian meetings. This has resulted in better awareness, motivation, school attendance, academic performance and more involvement of the children's guardians.

Surendran's Story

My name is Surendran. I am from a tea estate where my mother works as a daily wage worker. My father passed away 13 years ago and since then, life has been a tough climb for us. Despite our hardships, I managed to score 9A's in my O/L examinations. My dream is to become a doctor one day and give back to communities like mine. I have a younger brother and together with my family, we are navigating this journey, fueled by hope and determination.

COMMUNITY REHABILITATION

Batticaloa prison is one of the most overcrowded prisons in Sri Lanka with very minimal facilities including access to clean water. IMHO has helped fund project to improve water supply and provided table fans and recreational equipment to make their stay more humane. **Total cost \$8,000.**





IMHO is also supporting a vocational training program at the Jaffna jail. Most of the prisoners are recurrent offenders who wind up in jail due to addiction. Vocational training is an important step in rehabilitation, providing a future means to obtain income and also to reduce recidivism. We are supporting 20 females to learn tailoring and 25 males to learn welding. **Total cost \$3,500.**
